"Thank you for having us."



At this time, you may give them the present/box or sweets you bring to him.

"This is for you. I bought you a present."

"Thank you! It's perfect!





When the host takes you to the dining table, he will prepare the meals and the tea party will begin!

He will have other guests too.

If you want to ask for something you need, you can use these phrases:

"Could you pass me the salt, please?"

"May I have some water, please?"

"I would like more sugar in my coffee, please."

If you want to offer someone anything, you can use these phrases:

"Would you like a slice of cake?"

"Do you need more sugar?"

"Take one more cupcake, it is very tasty!"



When the tea party ends, you should thank the host and if you had fun you may tell him a nice comment about the tea party.

For example:

"I have a lot of fun and the meal was delicious. Thank you."

"I can't wait for the next tea party! It was amazing!"

"The drinks and the snacks were very tasty. Good job!"
